INTRODUCTION / METHODOLOGY / RESPONSES

INTRODUCTION

This is the fourth year in which Police Scotland has had the opportunity to undertake a country wide public consultation survey. It gives the organisation the ability to seek the views of Scotland's diverse communities and gives local people the chance to influence the setting of both National and Local policing priorities.

The survey results will provide valuable information regarding the public's attitude to crimes, antisocial behaviour and other issues that impact on communities and the priorities identified through the consultation will be reflected in future Force, Local and Multi Member Ward (MMW) policing plans.

The following report provides details of the result to date in quarter 1 of this financial year covering the period 7th April 2016 to 30th June 2016.

METHODOLOGY

In previous years the surveys were conducted by community Police officers gathering responses from their MMW areas where they had responsibility, with responses recorded on Survey Monkey.

In a change to this approach, from April 2016 an online Survey Monkey portal was created to allow the general public to complete the survey online with an alternative paper version available if required.

Through local engagement, community events and media campaigns etc, the general public were encouraged to access and complete the survey. As detailed below, the results from quarter 1 are very encouraging with a high number of surveys completed to date and almost every MMW in Scotland represented in the results produced. It is also evident from the demographic responses that the results include representation from all communities throughout Scotland.

RESPONSES

During quarter 1 (7th April 2016 to 30 June 2016), 10,075 Your View Counts surveys have been completed across Scotland with responses received from 351 out of 353 Multi Member Wards.

988 (9.8%) of the completed surveys have been successfully mapped against E Division - Edinburgh, with responses received from the 1 Council area and all 17 Multi Member Wards within the Division.

Results for every question have been collated and presented numerically and also as a percentage of all valid responses. The one exception is question 4 where percentages are based on 'Yes' or 'No' responses only to exclude the 'Not Applicable' responses.

We appreciate the number of people who took the time to provide additional comments and views when they completed the survey. Accessibility to and visibility of officers across our communities was a recurring theme. This will be the subject of review and feedback over forthcoming months as we continue the development of service.

The content of the survey was also highlighted. The first year of launch should be viewed as a test year during which we will continue to seek views which will be used to refine and enhance the product.
