KEY FACTS

In the ten years to 2017 Edinburgh's population grew by 12.5% from 456,000 to 513,000 people.

In the same time period Scotland grew by 4.9%.

The child population in Edinburgh (those aged between 0 and 15 years old) grew by 12.7% between 2007 and 2017.

In the same period Scotland's child population remained largely unchanged decreasing slightly by 0.7%.

2 Population change 2007 to 2017: Edinburgh, the Edinburgh city region and Scotland





Net migration was the main driver of population change in Edinburgh, Scotland and the city region during 2007 to 2017.


Edinburgh's birth rate per capita is higher than the Scottish average. In 2017 there were 10 births per 1,000 population (or one birth in every 100 people).


DID YOU KNOW

Net migration is inward minus outward migration, this includes migration to and from overseas, the rest of the UK and within Scotland.

Natural change is births minus deaths within the area.

4 Births and deaths in Edinburgh and Scotland per 1,000 population 2007 to 2017







5 Projected population of Edinburgh by age band 2016 to 2041 (2016 based projections)





Edinburgh population is projected to grow to 583,140 by 2041.


In 2017 Edinburgh has a higher proportion of people aged 16 to 49 than Scotland. Over half of males and females in Edinburgh are aged 16-49 year old (Male 53.5% and Females 52.4%.

In Scotland less than half of population are aged 16-49 year old (Male 46.4% and females 43.2%)

7 Scotland male and female age structure 2017 (% of male and female population)





8 Population in UK cities in 2017




9 Population change for UK cities, percentage and number, from 2007 to 2017

KEY FACTS

In 2017 Edinburgh population density was 1,950 residents per square kilometre.

Cities like Bristol, Birmingham, Liverpool and Manchester have over the twice the population density level in Edinburgh.

Edinburgh's population increase between 2007 to 2017 of 57,200 people was higher than most other UK cities. Only Manchester and Birmingham increased by a higher absolute number.


KEY FACTS

In 2016, 28% of Edinburgh's population lived in the North West locality area.

The South East locality contains the highest number of working age people in Edinburgh at 100,100 people aged between 16 and 64 years old.

In Leith Walk, 81.3% of the population living in that area are of working age.

In Colinton / Fairmilehead, 61.3% of the population living in that area are of working age.








12 Origin of overseas workers registered in Edinburgh 2015-17

Top Countries of origin: (Europe) Spain, Poland and Italy. (Beyond Europe) India, China, and USA.



14 Economic status of residents as a percentage of population aged 16 to 64 years in Edinburgh and UK cities 2018




15 Percentage of residents aged 16 to 64 years in employment in UK cities 2018

KEY FACTS

Edinburgh has a higher percentage (75.6%) of the working age population in employment than the average of major UK cities.

The main reasons in Edinburgh for being economically inactive include being a student (42.0%) or being retired (15.3%). These two reasons are more prominent in Edinburgh than in the average in other major UK cities, including the London region.





17 Model based estimate of unemployment rate in Edinburgh 2009 to 2018 (years April to March)




18 Average gross disposable household income per resident in major UK cities 2016

KEY FACTS

Edinburgh's unemployment rate over the last 10 years reached as high as 6.9% in 2014. In the year to March 2018 unemployment was 3.6%, which is the lower than other major UK cities, including London region.

The average gross disposable income in Edinburgh was £21,800 in 2016, higher than other UK major cities.

DID YOU KNOW?

Gross disposable household income is the amount of money that individuals, in the household sector, have available for spending or saving after taxes, social contributions and benefits have taken effect.

In 2017 the annual full time salary of a person working in Edinburgh was over £30,000. Only London has a higher median full time salary.

Edinburgh has a large proportion of workers in high skilled occupations. At 38.6% of all workers, this is more than other UK cities, including London (34.9%).



Around 50,000 people in Edinburgh are employed in the health sector. This industry sector makes up 15% of all jobs in Edinburgh.


In 2017, 9.9% of people in employment in Edinburgh were in the finance and insurance sector. This is twice as much as the average across other UK cities.

25 Edinburgh GVA as percentage of Scotland GVA 2016





26 Change in Edinburgh GVA 2011 to 2016 by industry






In 2016 the Gross Value Added per capita in Edinburgh was £39,300, higher than other major UK cities, with the exception of London.

Between 2001 and 2016 the Edinburgh economy, measured as GVA, grew by 21.2% This increase was larger than most UK cities.




KEY FACTS

44.1% of new businesses in Edinburgh are still trading after 5 years, a rate of survival higher than most other UK cities.

The number of registered enterprises in Edinburgh increased by 18.2% from 2012 to 2017. This is higher than the Scotland average of 10.5% over the same period.

The number of small enterprises in Edinburgh - businesses with less than 50 employees - increased by 19.7% from 2012 to 2017.

31 Change in number of registered enterprises by employee size band from 2012 to 2017






In 2016 there were 41.5 business per 1,000 resident in Edinburgh. This represents a higher business density than most other major UK cities.

Edinburgh has the second highest digital tech economy relative to its population size when compared to other UK cities.







38 Foreign direct investments in major UK cities: number of 12 months to March 2018



EU owned enterprises in Edinburgh employed 22,510 people in 2017 up by 40.5% from 16,020 in 2012.









45 Edinburgh average footfall by location and time (selected 4 hour periods) in August 2018



KEY FACTS

Footfall levels in the city centre of Edinburgh are highest on Saturdays, with an daily average of 18,800 in August, 16,500 in April and 19,800 in December.

In Edinburgh's Princes Street footfall during December 2017 was higher than in August 2018. The average daily footfall on Princes Street in August 2018 was 42,500 people compared to 47,200 in December 2017.

In the Grassmarket area, during August, footfall was higher in the evening period than during the morning. In the four hours between 8PM and midnight average footfall was 2,600, 100 higher than the 8AM to midday period.







Edinburgh has nine cinema sites open year round with 66 cinema screens and just over 12,000 seats available.






53 Overseas visitors to Edinburgh by purpose of visit 2017







60 International audience attendance by major festivals 2017





In the two years 2016 to 2017 there were 1,575 hotel room completions in Edinburgh.

In total, 5,000 new hotel rooms were completed in Edinburgh over the last 10 years. Around 30% of these were completed in the last two years.

Edinburgh's active pipeline of hotel development is comparable with other major UK cities with an expected increase in the existing hotel room supply of 14.5% in the next two years.



Edinburgh had the highest hotel occupancy out of all UK cities in 2017. In 2017 the average occupancy rate in Edinburgh was 83.7%.


The average price for a hotel room in Edinburgh was £103 in 2017, this compares to the average price for a room in London at £149 per night.












70 Higher Education undergraduate and Postgraduate students in Edinburgh by establishment 2017



73 Percentage of UK students in Higher Education in major UK cities 2017







74 Percentage of non-UK students in Higher Education in UK cities 2017




75 Higher Education students per 1,000 population in UK cities 2017





77 Percentage of female workforce educated to degree level or above in major UK cities 2017



78 Percentage of male workforce educated to degree level or above in major UK cities 2017





79 Percentage of household waste recycled in Scottish cities year to March 2017























93 Percentage change in number of households in Scottish cities and Scotland from 2007 to 2017












97 Change in number of dwellings by type 2007 to 2017









102 Number of properties per hectare by Edinburgh locality 2017




104 Percentage of housing owner occupied in Scottish Cities 2016


107 Household composition by size type in Edinburgh 2016











117 Annual change in average house prices April 2018







119 Number of house sales in Edinburgh by month




120 Student housing development completions number of rooms 2010 to 2017



122 Number of new start builds in Edinburgh 2013 to 2017





125 Passenger numbers (millions) Edinburgh airport 2013 to 2017





126 Top ten international destinations from Edinburgh Airport by passenger numbers 2017




127 Top ten international cities from Edinburgh Airport by passenger numbers 2017








130 Percentage that take car or taxi to work in Scottish cities 2017



131 Percentage that walk to work in Scottish cities 2017







133 Main mode of travel Edinburgh to get around 2017












