

SHE (Social - Health & Education) Scotland. SHE is a driving force for future generations of girls and young women, supporting them to realise their potential and positively impact on their community.



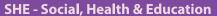

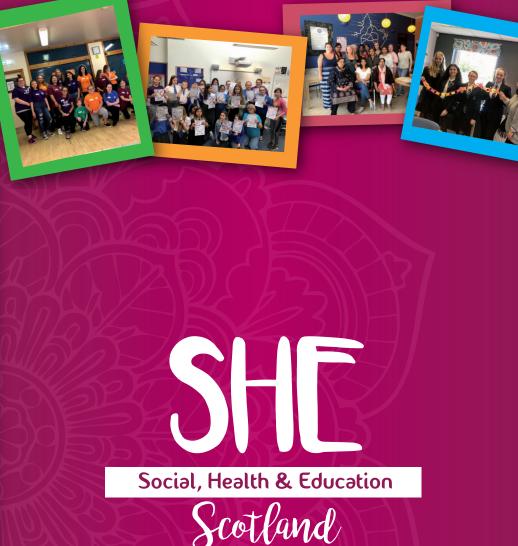

SHE Scotland girl zones are designed to improve the wellbeing of girls and young women by creating a supportive environment for them to feel safe to open up to others.

Sept Connors SHE Scotland believe girls and young women need to have a space to discuss, raise questions and get support. Our workshops are fun, informative and designed to engage participants in discussions around various issues. Participants will be supported to develop their skills, interests, to challenge themselves, have fun, make friends and reach their full potential as individuals.

Being part of the community is key in the development of responsible girls or young women. Social interaction with new people of different ages. Community girl zones lead to a greater emphasis on the understanding of their emotions and behaviours and the impact that these have on others.
