The programme will give locals the opportunity to share stories of times spent at Torry Battery in Aberdeen.
OutFest	Shaper Caper Limited	£41,400	Dundee	The project will help the group to stage OutFest, which will take place in February 2024 as part of LGBT History Month. The event will be open to all and will help build connections between the LGBTQ+ community and the wider public.
Coping with Cancer in Ayrshire	Ayrshire Cancer Support	£50,000	East Ayrshire	This project will improve the wellbeing of people across Ayrshire affected by cancer, whether through their own diagnosis or that of someone close to them. Ayrshire Cancer Support are a charity who operate Support Centres in Kilmarnock and Ayr, as well as offering home therapeutic work and hospital transport.

This will help to improve the mental health and wellbeing of the young people in this area of high deprivation.

Children will play in a safe welcoming place, be provided with healthy meals each day and have the opportunity to meet their sporting heroes.
