Tickets can be posted, if booked 2 weeks ahead, for £1.50. Venue collection 30 mins before for free.

Booking during the festival: Online until 10am on the day of the event. On the door from 30 mins before. Payment at venues is **cash only**. You may reserve tickets for events later in the day at a venue box office.

Facilities: Venues vary; see info at www.eastneukfestival.com/venues and contact us if you have concerns not covered.

Doors open 30 mins before, unless specified. Venues do not have sheltered waiting areas.

Children under 7s not admitted except to Big Project. Any ticket is £5 for 7-17 year olds.

Latecomers are not guaranteed admission, in whole or in part. If admitted, it may not be possible to take the seat you booked - standing may be the only option.

Refunds: We cannot offer refunds unless an event is cancelled. We accept returns only in exceptional circumstances and cannot guarantee to resell tickets.

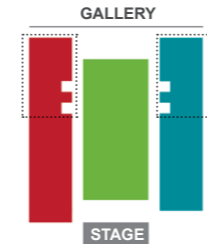

The 20th ENF is all about wonderful music and music making, old friends, new faces, happy times and all things festive!
We have four big themes:

BEETHOVEN'S LATE QUARTETS

Four of the world's top quartets have thrilled ENF audiences more than any other and returned most often: Belcea, Castalian, Elias and Pavel Haas. Nowhere else will you find them sharing the same stage, but for us they come together to perform Beethoven's late quartets, quintets by Mozart and Schubert, Mendelssohn's Octet and Sally Beamish's new piece for all four quartets together.

SCHUBERT 1823-1828

These five years saw Schubert create masterpieces aplenty from among which we hear two song cycles and his string quintet in C. No one surpasses Mark Padmore in *Winterreise*, and he is complemented by rising star James Newby in *Die Schöne Müllerin* before they join forces in *Schwanengesang* with Joseph Middleton at the piano throughout.

SEAN SHIBE

In the past decade, Shibe has emerged as a musician of instinct and flair in whom technical mastery and musicality are allied to a venturesome spirit. For us, he plays the most famous guitar music in the world - Rodrigo's *Concierto de Aranjuez* - before embarking on a day-long journey spanning five centuries of music for lute, guitar and electric guitar.

OLD FRIENDS

Most of the musicians in this programme have appeared at ENF many times, but we are especially happy to welcome back two who came to ENF Retreat as students and are now at the height of their professions - Diyang Mei (Principal Viola of the Berlin Philharmonic) and Sergio Pires (Principal Clarinet of the LSO). Also, a very special performance of Beethoven's Septet brings violinist Alexander Janiczek back to Fife alongside several players who performed at the very first Fife performance of this piece which led to the creation of ENF.
