Aberdeen Amateur Radio Society	National Lottery Awards for All Scotland	£800 Aberdeen City	The group will run a small one-day Ham Radio festival that will involve the community and those taking part in the Tall Ships event as it stops in Aberdeen in July 2024.
Asylum and Refugee Care (AARC) SCIO	National Lottery Awards for All Scotland	£20,000 Aberdeen City	This two year project will create a welcoming and inclusive environment for New Scots in the Aberdeen area. Their project will be run through a number of community-driven activities and will provide valuable volunteering opportunities.
Befriend a Child	National Lottery Awards for All Scotland	£18,400 Aberdeen City	The group will run a two-year community befriending project supporting 40 school aged children who are living in difficult home circumstances and are socially isolated in their local communities. Matched with an adult volunteer, the children will benefit from twice monthly outings in the community for at least a year.
CLAN Cancer Support	Improving Lives	£187,103 Aberdeen City	This group will continue to deliver their Children and Families Service (CFS) in Aberdeen, Aberdeenshire, Moray, Orkney and Shetland. This service is available to any family requiring support, information and advice during a cancer journey. Therapeutic sessions help the young person develop coping skills to manage change and regulate their emotional responses (fear, anxiety, anger and loss). This support enables them to navigate their feelings around the disease and build resilience.
COG (Community Outreach Group) Aberdeen	National Lottery Awards for All Scotland	£17,000 Aberdeen City	This volunteer based organisation deliver services in Aberdeen that support the homeless, those with mental health issues, those with addiction issues and people struggling with the cost of living crisis. The two year grant will support rent and utility costs in their premises in King Street.
Fersands and Fountain Community Project	Community Led	£98,166 Aberdeen City	This three-year project will use the funding to continue and develop their community support services. The group will also purchase a minibus that will support activities and people in the community, from youth club outings to shopping trips for older people.

The service is based in the Maggie's Centre within Aberdeen Royal Infirmary and will support families across Grampian.

Oakley ASN Ltd	National Lottery Awards for All Scotland	£20,000 Aberdeenshire	This project will support the first year's running costs of a purpose-built sensory activity and respite centre for young people affected by complex neurodivergent and additional support needs.
Outdoor & Woodland Learning North East Group	Improving Lives	£120,000 Aberdeenshire	This group will continue to deliver their bespoke delivery of 'Branching Out', a greenspace recovery programme for people coping with problematic alcohol/drug use (PSU) or severe and enduring mental health challenges. Through the course of six 12-week blocks, people will take part in a variety of outdoor activities that reflect the group's shared interests and are chosen by them.
Pillar Kincardine	Improving Lives	£100,000 Aberdeenshire	This charity will provide local and community-based support for people affected by an emotional crisis or long-term mental health issues. Services are designed to encourage 'self-management' through a blend of one to one support and facilitated groups. After developing a personal action plan people have a choice of services to aid their recovery and take back control of their life. Around 450 people from the Kincardine and Mearns region of Aberdeenshire are expected to benefit.

This three-year project will provide support to around 1000 people from Aberdeenshire, Aberdeen, Moray and Tayside supported by 60 volunteers.
